

Biographical Information

Judith V. Reppy, Ph.D., is professor emerita in the Department of Science and Technology and Studies and a Graduate School Professor at Cornell University. She is also a former director and associate director of the Peace Studies Program (now the Judith Reppy Institute for Peace and Conflict Studies). She has been a visiting fellow at the Science Studies Unit (Edinburgh University), Science & Technology Studies (Manchester University), the Science Policy Research Unit (Sussex University), and the Center for International Studies (MIT). She was co-chair of US Pugwash from 1995-2000 and in 2002-03 served on the National Academy of Sciences' Committee on Research Standards and Practices to Prevent the Destructive Application of Biotechnology ("the Fink Committee"). Dr. Reppy's current research interests include dual-use technology, export control policy, and the impact of WikiLeaks on journalism and on diplomatic practices. Her most recent book is *Getting to Zero: The Path to Nuclear Disarmament* (Stanford University Press, 2011), co-editor (with Catherine Kelleher) and author.
