David Holloway is the Raymond A. Spruance Professor in International History, Professor of Political Science and of History, and Senior Fellow at the Freeman-Spogli Institute for International Studies, at Stanford University. Born in Ireland, he received his BA, MA, and PhD from the University of Cambridge. Before joining the Stanford faculty in 1986, he taught at the Universities of Lancaster and Edinburgh.

He is the author of *The Soviet Union and the Arms Race* (Yale U.P., 1983) and *Stalin and the Bomb: the Soviet Union and Atomic Energy, 1939-1956* (Yale U.P., 1994). With Sidney Drell and Philip Farley he wrote *The Reagan Strategic Defense Initiative: A Technical, Political, and Arms Control Assessment* (Ballinger, 1985). His current projects include an international history of nuclear weapons and a collaborative effort to explore the steps that could lead to a world without nuclear weapons.
