**Giuseppina Orlandini** is Senior Professor of Nuclear and Subnuclear Physics at the University of Trento. She was born in Tolentino (MC) Italy on June 30, 1952, graduated in Physics at the University of Bologna, was postdoc for two years at the University of Mainz, became associated professor and later full professor at the University of Trento. She spent sabbatical periods at CERN, University of Saskatchewan (Canada) and George Washington University (Washington DC, USA). She is author of about 200 publications in Theoretical Nuclear Physics with focus on electromagnetic reactions with nuclei and quantum theory of few-nucleon systems. She has taught courses in Nuclear Physics, Quantum Mechanics and recently a course on Nuclear Weapons and Disarmament.

She has in fact developed an interest in disarmament topics in the 80's when she joined the Italian Union of Scientists for Disarmament (USPID). She led the local group of USPID for about 20 years, organizing academic and public activities on nuclear weapons and disarmament topics, as well as tutoring young coscience objectors assigned to the USPID organization.

In 1988 she promoted the winter series of ISODARCO schools, which are still held yearly in the Trento region and has been among the organizers for many editions. She is member of the ISODARCO Board of Directors. Recently, in her capacity of member of the UNI-Trento Senate she has promoted the partecipation of UNI-Trento to RUNIPACE the Network of Universities for Peace.
